HOW IT ALL BEGAN

Sometime in the 1970s, Maulana Kalbe Sadiq was visiting a relative's house in Old Lucknow when a man came up to him and requested that the Maulana accompany him to a house nearby. The man led Dr Sadiq to a dilapidated dwelling, where, under the dim light of an oil lamp, sat a young boy engrossed in study.

"He's my son," the man said. "He is keen to study and is extremely hardworking. However, I do not have the means to fulfill his wish." Dr Sadiq interacted with the boy and was impressed with his intellect and perseverance. He was convinced that the boy would do well academically if given a chance to study, and this would in turn help the boy bring his family out of poverty. Dr Sadiq wrote a letter to a Mumbai-based acquaintance, Late Mr Jafar Ali Aseel,

asking him if he could support the boy's education financially. Mr Aseel responded by sending over funds to cover expenses for two years of the boy's education. The beneficiary went on to complete his graduation with very good marks.

While Dr Sadiq was happy over the boy's changed fortunes, he realised that there were many children with little hope for a better future because of their disadvantaged backgrounds. He continued to identify such needy and deserving children, asking friends and acquaintances to sponsor their studies. Soon, however, it was clear to him that for large-scale impact, there was a need to take up the mission in a more structured manner. In 1984, professionals in the

field of education were brought together and Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) was formed. The name was inspired by the need for education as well as unity among the Muslims to rid the community of widespread ignorance and poverty.

TMT's progress over the years is remarkable considering its humble beginnings. The first institution to come up under TMT was Unity College, which started in 1988 in a small, rented room with the most basic infrastructure and a handful of students. One of the challenges that TMT faced during this period was that in the area it was based in, parents' attitudes towards education needed to be changed for them to be able to see its scope and utility. However, the fact that TMT was professionally run and

driven by genuine concern for the disadvantaged soon attracted several supporters to the venture. Using the same premises, the Unity College Second Shift started a decade later with nine students to provide underprivileged, deserving children free education.

Today, both the institutions together have over 3500 students enrolled for academic pursuits on a state-of-the-art campus.

Several educational and medical institutions as well as charity programmes are either run or supported by the Trust. TMT is grateful to its generous donors who have supported it throughout the journey and facilitated the transition of a dream to reality.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

Dr. S. Kalbe Sadiq's message

Islam lays great emphasis on continuous learning. It says wisdom and inspiration, irrespective of the source they come from, should be assimilated without hesitation.

And so, to all my brothers who face backwardness and seek progress, let me present the tale of a community that underwent immense hardship and oppression, and yet transformed a life of humiliation into one of dignity.

"We've all heard of the ill-treatment once meted out to Jews in Germany. They were burnt alive, millions were killed, and the remaining were driven out of their own land. These Jews, undeniably oppressed, sought refuge in the US, but even there they were

not readily welcomed. At clubs, beaches and hotels, they were met with boards that read: "Dogs and Jews are not allowed". Obviously, such treatment in a free country, towards a people already broken and distraught, caused further despair within the community. Some suggested protests, processions and demand charters, but the intelligent leadership of the community advised against wasting time and effort on these methods. Instead, they advocated a determined pursuit of education and financial robustness.

The leadership was wise and was trusted by the community. The Jews concentrated their energies on alleviating ignorance and poverty in their midst through education and

economic uplift. The results were visible soon-The Jews who once sought shelter in America now have America under their fold. They have a great extent of control over media, education, and business. If the Jews today decide to leave US, the administration will plead before them to stay, for they play a major role in running the country.

There's another example from the same community. When Israel was established in 1948, the well-off within the community went to the chief rabbi and said, "Jehovah has given us the promised land and now our government is in place too. We now want to express our gratitude towards Jehovah." The chief rabbi asked, "And how do you propose to do that?" The reply was typical of religious men. They said they wanted to build the grandest-ever synagogue, a place of worship that surpassed any that the Muslims, Christians or Hindus had. However, the rabbi was a very wise man. He said, "Even if we build a synagogue out of diamonds, what will its stature be in the eyes of the Creator who brought the entire universe into existence? So shun this idea, and if you have saved up for such a grand monument, let us use these riches instead to remove poverty and ignorance from our community." It is a result of such visionary leadership that today, a relatively tiny community has the maximum number of Nobel prizes and is treated with respect everywhere in the world. The same Germany from where Jews were ruthlessly expelled now offers them special privileges.

So this is a principle: When a community's religious leadership is serious, intelligent, and has a sense of sacrifice, it does not want to stand upon the shoulders of its people. Instead, it uplifts the community

Born on June 26, 1934 at Kutch, Mundra in India, Chacha Paryani emigrated to and spent his creative years in Songea in the southern region of Tanzania. He shifted to Toronto, Canada in 1974 and immediately got involved in community activities with a reformer's zeal.

Chacha Paryani was actively engaged in charitable initiatives with Sajjadiyya Trust as its executive director since the inception of the Trust in 1993 and visited India and Pakistan annually ever since. The projects the Trust supported pertained to construction of schools, clinics, housing for the homeless and slum dwellers, scholarships and educational grants to children from underprivileged backgrounds, and medical assistance to those who could not afford healthcare.

We at TMT look forward to a continued and similarly fruitful relationship with Mr Mohsin Khimji, who took over as executive director of M/s Sajjadiyya Trust Canada on 1st Aug 2016

where there are millionaires and billionaires in their midst, they keep all their religiosity in their hearts and do not let it manifest on the streets, in rituals, or in grand places of worship. On Saturdays, when the devout head to their unassuming synagogues in groups of twos and threes, they do so silently, without causing any disturbance to normal life.

When religious leadership is capable, it makes the community fight against poverty, illiteracy and corruption. On the other hand, when religious leadership lacks vision or is corrupt, it makes people of different faiths fight each other.

It is unfortunate that by and large, the leadership among Muslims is neither visionary nor sincere. The Shias are pitched against Sunnis, the Deobandis are made to fight Barelvis, and so on. They exhaust themselves doing this, and this is why they face greater humiliation across the world with each passing day. All of this breeds frustration, which in turn fosters organisations like ISIS and Al-Qaeda. It is a vicious cycle.

In the end, I only want to say that people

and communities have their fate in their own hands. Raising slogans, firing bullets, and taking the life of innocents has never solved any problem.

I conclude my message with an exchange between Prophet Muhammad and Hazrat Ali. The Prophet asked Hazrat Ali, "Ali, if a man is bad towards you, how will you be towards him?" Hazrat Ali replied, "If a man is bad towards me, I will be good towards him". The Prophet asked, "What if he is bad towards you a second time? What will your reaction be then?" "I will be good to him, nevertheless," Ali said. The Prophet asked the same question several times, and always received the same answer. "But why will you be good towards someone who is repeatedly bad towards you?" the Prophet asked. "Because If a man is unwilling to leave the bad in him, how can I abandon the good in me?", Ali said.

These are the golden words that everyone, especially Muslims, should keep in their heart at all times.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Another eventful year has gone by here at TMT. On behalf of the Trust, I would like to thank everyone who has helped us overcome challenges and maintain the pace of progress. It is the commitment of hundreds and thousands of people-Our donors, students, staff and beneficiaries-that remains a source of hope and inspiration for us, and drives TMT towards continuous improvement. However, as always, there is scope to do better. In the summary below, I have tried to highlight the positives in green. Areas that we need to work on are marked in red.

UNITY COLLEGE, LUCKNOW

- 100% pass percentage in Board exams.
- 20 students secured 90% and above marks.
- Phonetics-based English teaching has been giving good results for the past two years.
- Round-the-year training and monitoring by UK based expert Mrs Sabira – We acknowledge and value her dedication and voluntary contribution.
- Infrastructure being developed as per master plan– Campus has upgraded its power supply capacity and switched to LED lighting.
- Dental Clinic established on campus by Vancouver's Global Kindness Foundation.
- Majority of passouts getting into professional courses offered by private universities and institutes. School needs a plan to create a class of students with high competitive edge and facilitate admissions to accredited premiere institutes like IITs and IIMs.
- NCC and Scouting needs to be introduced – application in queue with

directorate.

- Due to relatively low fee structure & fee-paying capacity of parents, it is difficult to retain & attract good teachers at salaries at par with the market.
- Process is on to step up relationship with

school alumni.

- The cost of operations is being met by fee with no fiscal deficit, but infrastructure development and expansion work are being funded by TMT's donor base.

UNITY COLLEGE SECOND SHIFT, LUCKNOW

- Once again, Montessori method employed in nursery classes so as to make up for the lack of learning environment at most students' home.
- All students scored 1st division marks in class X and XII board exams.
- Increase in number of students securing admission in undergraduate programs of reputed institutions after passing out of class 12th.
- Professional agency MEDHA engaged to conduct regular soft skills and computer skills training apart from conducting counselling classes for students. This has added visible value to the personality of our students.
- Time constraint due to two shifts limits sports and computer literacy activities.
- Male students are lagging behind the female students, hence we are developing a plan to enhance their performance and make them more proactive.
- Communication skills in English need considerable improvement.
- Quality of teachers needs to be enhanced through regular in-house training programs.

M.U COLLEGE, ALIGARH

- The college attracts students from several states and is a mini-India in itself.
- A new basketball court was constructed and Dormitories and toilets in the old hostel block were renovated.
- Proficiency of students in English needs to be improved through remedial classes.
- Preparing our students to seek admission in Aligarh University through various competitions.
- Maximize the capacity of Hostel through quality enrollments mainly in grade V, VI and VII.
- Improve awareness about the school

and its quality facilities among Aligarh residents so as to increase the

enrollment of day scholars.

- Need to scale up the program both in terms of numbers and reaching out to

other community pockets in Uttar Pradesh.

UNITY PRIVATE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (UPITI)

- 100% pass results and 100% placement.
- In partnership with PAI VEDA Pune UPITI started U-Veda which offers B.Sc. Diploma and Certificate Courses in Multi Media and Animation.
- All the workshops upgraded with equipment as per revised NCVT norms.
- Professional specialist organization MEDHA engaged for personality development of trainees and to give them industrial exposure.
- Companies like Godrej, Daikin, Johnson Lifts, L&T Switchgears visited UPITI for hiring or training purposes.
- Development of New Campus remains on hold due to overstretched statutory requirements for seeking government approval of plan layouts. Hence, we are working on alternative options so that work on new campus can be initiated this year.
- Starting new trades like mobile repairs and drivers training.
- Take up a campaign to enhance the awareness of vocational training.

EDUCATIONAL AID

- ₹18 million disbursed to 2550 educational aid beneficiaries this year.
- Educational assistance to students from primary to higher professional education on merit cum means basis.
- TMT assessment test (TAT) was introduced over and above regular evaluation process to enhance the quality of selection.
- Those who performed well in TAT were offered Bonus Scholarships to assist them in taking admissions in better schools.
- Collaboration with Professional education institute around Lucknow to seek concessional fee packages for students.
- Unsatisfactory response to our efforts towards identifying high merit students at 12+ level and investing upfront on coaching them for entrance exams for premiere institutes. TMT is working to repeat the initiatives with corrective measures.

GENERAL AID

- ₹7 million disbursed to 3400 general aid beneficiaries this year.
- Our micro finance program helped many find their feet.

UNITY EDUCATION PROGRAM (FREE EDUCATION PROGRAM)

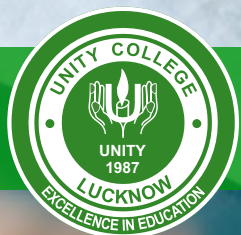
- UEP is a cost-free program for children of families living below poverty line and are highly vulnerable towards exploitation as child labor.
- 1500 students enrolled in 25 schools across 10 towns/villages.
- Average attendance of students rose to 90%.
- Students' average marks in TMT's Quality Control Test: 51%.
- Awards were bestowed on 208 meritorious students for academics and attendance along with parents, school teachers and schools.
- Best performers were transferred to accredited institutions. (3 to Unity College, Lucknow, 11 as day scholars and 22 to MU College, Aligarh, as hostellers)
- Students' proficiency in English language needs to be enhanced.
- Need to scale up model in other locations despite resources constraint.

HIZA HOSPITAL

- Plan to upgrade the infrastructure and quality of services as per international standards under advice of team of Doctors in USA.
- Developing and switching onto computer-based record management system and ID cards.

TMT OPERATIONS

- With a dedicated team, TMT serves as a head office, where all projects, allied institutions, as well as aid programmes are managed.
- Website and social media presence has been improved.



UNITY COLLEGE, LUCKNOW





Unity Pvt Industrial Training Institute (Unity Pvt ITI), established in 1995-96 under TMT, is presently functioning in a 30-room setup on the campus of Unity College, Husainabad, Lucknow. The endeavor is supported by Mr Shokat Alibhai and Mr Mustafa Kassam.

The institute recognizes the importance of vocational training in a world where the demand for skilled workers is ever-growing. The courses have been particularly useful for those looking for gainful employment in the near future.

Constant efforts are being made to improve the training pattern to suit the latest industrial trends and to adhere to government guidelines. Initiatives in the pipeline include a new building exclusively for Unity Pvt ITI, purchase of equipment as per latest QCI standards, and to establish a placement cell.

The number of trainees, both in affiliated trades and also in short term courses increased considerably during the year under review. The session also saw as many as 113 trainees getting placed in various organisations of repute after completing our courses.

Rapid advancement in technology has opened up new possibilities in the computer animation industry. Some estimates suggest that India's animation industry will grow at a faster pace than the IT industry.

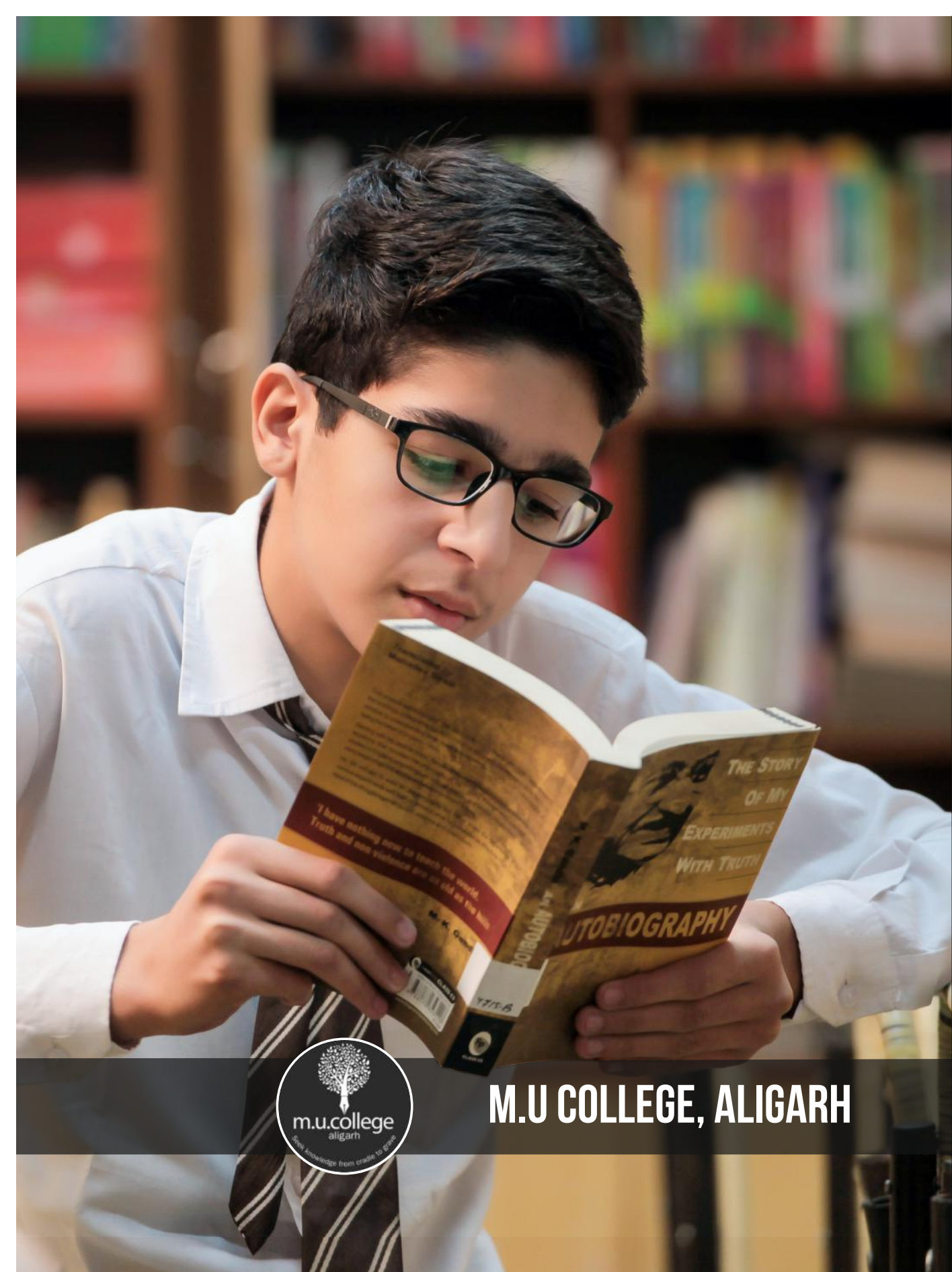

Affiliated to Council For The Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), MU College, Aligarh is a unique institution imparting modern education in conjunction with Islamic studies up to class XII. Employing a novel pedagogy, the college endeavors to facilitate intellectual, moral, and spiritual development of its students to create holistic individuals capable of contributing positively to the society.

The seamless blending of two methods of learning, often mistakenly seen as contradictory, is apparent in MU College's infrastructure. For instance, if on one hand it has state-of-the-art science laboratories, on the other, the college stocks nearly 10,000 religious books in its library.

MU College, has 1,26,000 sqft campus houses both the main college building and the residential hostel, which serves as second home for students from across the country.

While the session 2016-2017 was dedicated to academic robustness and increased student participation in extra-curricular activities, the goals ahead include starting of nursery classes, on-campus personality development programs, and to provide Wi-Fi facility.

UNITY EDUCATION PROGRAM

Former UN General Secretary Kofi Annan once said, "Education is the premise of progress, in every society, in every family". TMT's Unity Education Programme (UEP), which was launched in 2004, has been witness to such transformational power of education. UEP is an effort to bring out-of-school children back into the fold of formal education. Apart from providing cost free education, UEP lays great stress on both the students and their parents, as the beneficiaries of the program are the first-generation learners. This is one of the reasons for marked increase in students' attendance in class (Around 90% in 2016-17), and parents' presence in PTMs.

Under UEP, deserving students are selected in rural and urban areas and provided cost-free education which includes uniform, stationery and transport facility. At present, approximately 1500 students are enrolled in 25 schools across 3 states. To ensure that educational standards are maintained irrespective of the institution in which the child is enrolled, the UEP cell conducts an annual Quality Control Test (QCT).

Considering the positive results derived from the UEP coaching centres in Allahabad, plans are afoot to start similar classes for students of Barabanki, Jaunpur, Aligarh and Lucknow. The year also saw some measures to cut conveyance and stationery costs. For example, by reusing old textbooks in good condition, there was a saving of nearly Rs 4.4 lakh this year.

HIZA CHARITABLE HOSPITAL

Hazrat Imam Zainul Abideen (HIZA) Charitable Hospital was set up in 1991 and was initially under the management Ahlulbayt Foundation, Mumbai. Since 1992, the hospital is completely managed by Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust and is patronized by Maulana Sayed Mohd Al-Moosavi and Dr S Kalbe Sadiq. Since it operates in an area severely lacking in quality and affordable healthcare, the hospital is particularly beneficial for people residing in the vicinity. HIZA provides medicines at nominal rates to those below the poverty line. All services are free for widows, destitutes, and orphans.

Immunisation, diagnostic, and awareness camps are routinely organised by HIZA. The hospital, offers a day's medicines for just Rs 5, has now started issuing ID cards and computerised every counter for increased efficiency. The homeopathy centre which started in 2015 has also been a big success.

Microscopy DOTS Centre, a unit of WHO in collaboration with government TB Hospital, Thakurganj (Lucknow) is running at HIZA. The centre conducts sputum examination and provides quality anti-tuberculosis drugs free of cost. Nearly 90% of the patients enrolled were fully cured of the disease in 2016.

MEDICAL AID PROGRAM

The Ministry of Health recently estimated that a whopping 63 million people have slipped back to poverty every year due to "mounting" expenditure over healthcare which neutralises the gains of rising income and various government schemes aimed to reduce poverty. Since for many Indians, healthcare services continue to be out of reach in terms of both access and affordability, TMT offers medical aid to those below the poverty line through a network of hospitals for free or at a nominal cost. As part of a cooperative partnership between hospitals and TMT, patients are treated at nominal rates in several hospitals. In addition, our



generous donors enable us to bear a share of the costs for diagnostic, procedural and medication fees.

The Life Saver Program is offered through us by the M/s Sajjadiyya Trust & M/s CJMF Foundation of Canada. More than 65 critical care patients in life-threatening conditions received intensive care treatments under the program.

LIFE SAVER CASES

Living in a one-room kuchcha house with his wife and three dependent children in Sitapur, 45-year-old zari worker Abbas Husain was struggling to make ends meet when he was diagnosed with a serious heart ailment four years ago. Two of his daughters took to zari work to support the family, but even that couldn't ensure timely and essential medical care for Husain. In January 2017, his health deteriorated drastically and he was rushed to Lari Cardiology at Lucknow. The family, at this juncture, was penniless. This is when TMT stepped in and covered expenses amounting to Rs 80,000 for Husain's angioplasty. The patient is now fit & able to carry out his familial and work responsibilities.

Mr. Haider, aged about 48 years, was engaged in book binding work in Lucknow and earned around Rs 5000 per month. In December 2016, he developed heart complications, and following a checkup by the doctor, he was advised heart surgery. As the cost of necessary treatment was very high, the applicant contacted TMT for financial assistance. Considering the urgency and criticality of the case, the medical expenses pertaining to the heart surgery were borne by the Trust. The patient has now recovered and is living a normal life. His son is studying in class XII at Unity Mission School. His daughter too has been receiving scholarship from TMT.



GENERAL AID

Old Lucknow resident Shazia, aged just about 30 years, was diagnosed with cancer in 2011. After a point of time, her husband, a painter by profession, was unable to bear the cost of her treatment at King George's Medical College. In fact, even running the household was a challenge. The family contacted TMT, after which Shazia's treatment costs were borne by the Trust. Her son is enrolled in class IV in Columbia School, Lucknow, under TMT's Unity Education Program. The family also received Ramzan food hampers & monthly ration aid from TMT.

Mrs Waseem, 35, lost her electrician husband in a transformer accident in 2016. She lives in her in-laws' house in Old Lucknow with three children, one of whom, her 13-year-old son, is mentally challenged. Apart from regular ration aid, TMT now bears the educational expenses of two of her children. While Sadiq is enrolled in Chetna School for special kids, the fee of one of her daughters is also paid by TMT.

When Waqar Husain died after a long battle with cancer, the entire family's responsibility fell on his wife Riyaz Bano. TMT, which had hitherto covered Waqar's medical expenses, now took their three children under its fold, while Riyaz opened a tailoring shop. The family also received medical assistance from time to time apart from monthly ration aid from TMT. Riyaz's eldest daughter was married in 2016, in which TMT pitched in with Rs 20000.

OTHER AID PROGRAMS

MICRO ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: Unless factors like age, health or tragic circumstances necessitate external support, TMT believes in fostering self-dependence and providing a gentle push to help individuals find their feet. Over the years, TMT has screened and identified several cases in which one-time micro-assistance was enough to ensure sustained livelihood. The aid disbursed includes sewing machines, batteries for e-rikshaws, carts, makeshift shop counters and other things as per requirement.

RAMZAN FOOD HAMPERS: Nearly 1100 food hampers at the cost of Rs 1.8 million were distributed in the holy month of Ramzan in and around Lucknow.

SPREADING WARMTH: With temperatures sometimes dipping to as low as 2-3 degrees Centigrade, winters can get particularly harsh in this part of the world. Hundreds of blankets were distributed by TMT this year to help the needy cope with the winter.

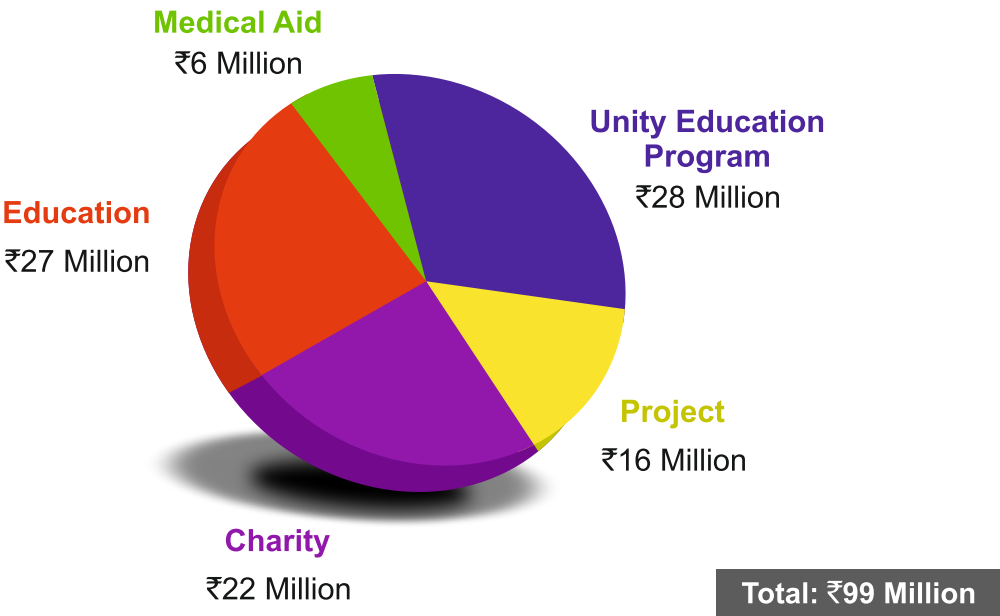

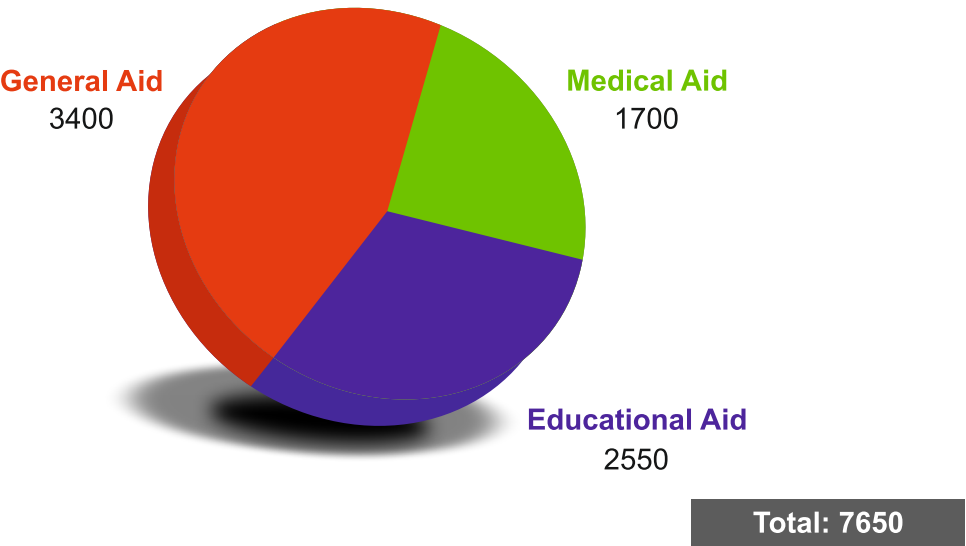
STATISTICS AT A GLANCE

Combined Graph of TMT & Canadian Principal

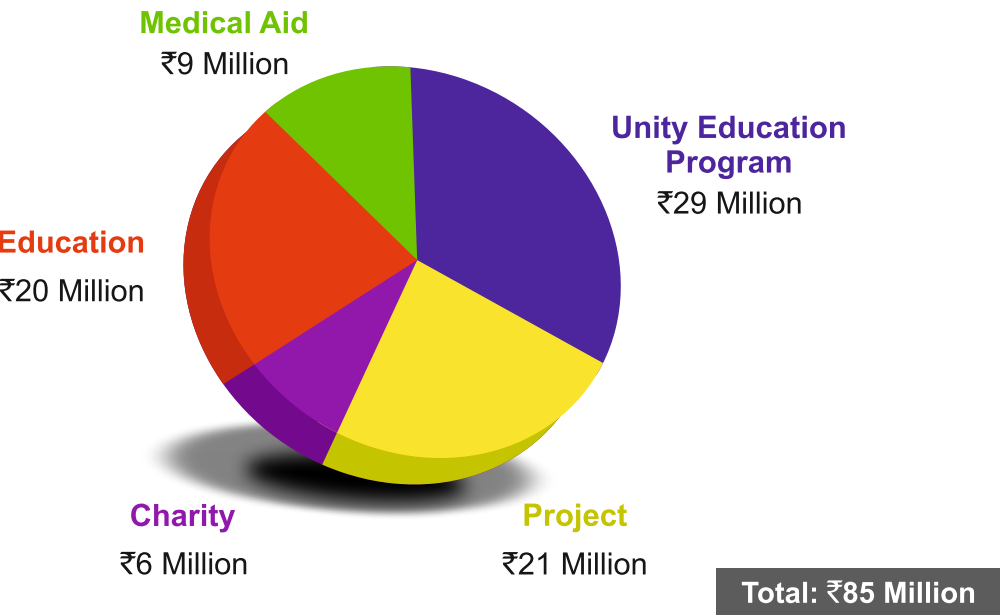
Head wise Income



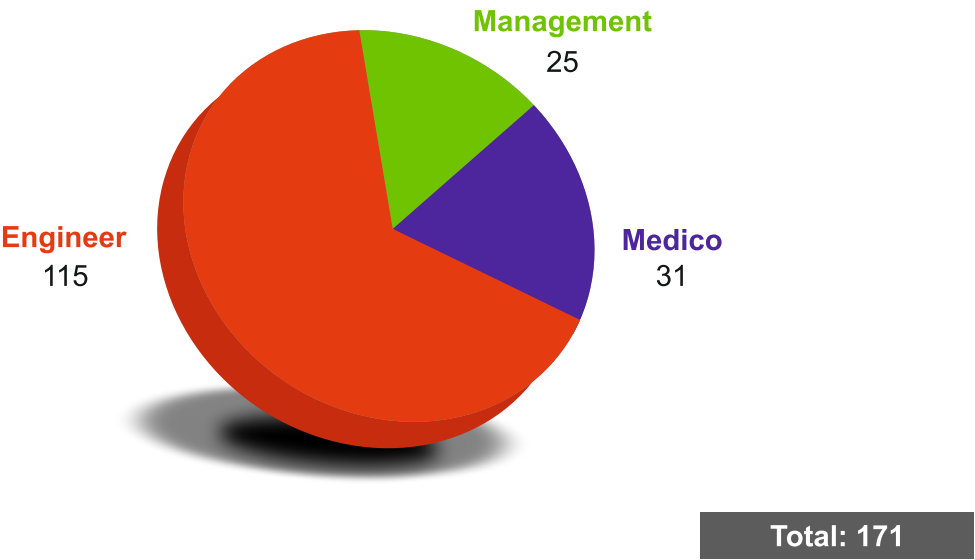
Beneficiaries

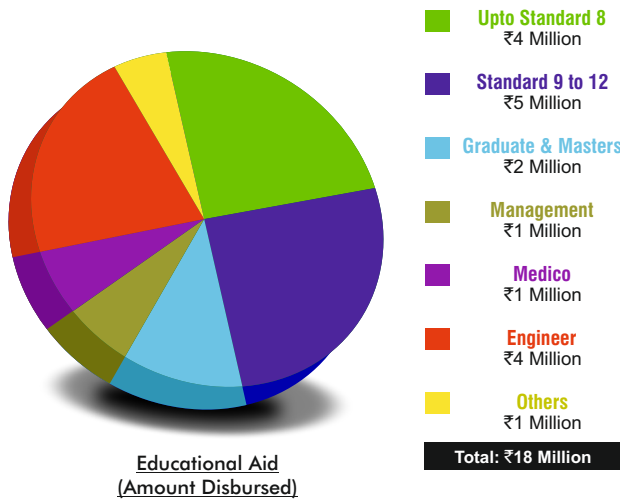

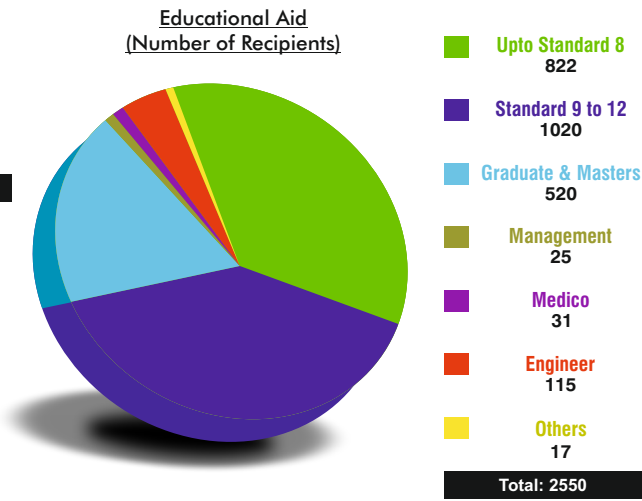
